
Welcome to 2nd Grade Language Arts Summer Packet Reading



Reading everyday over the summer is important to exercise your child's brain to get ready for Second Grade! Students are expected to read daily and a selection of suggested books can be found below. Students are to log the books they read on the Summer Reading Log below. Additionally, your child will be completing two assignments for separate books—one fiction book and one nonfiction book.

1.) Fiction Book Assignment: Memory Bag

Memory Bag

Students will bring a bag with objects that represent the story elements from their selected book of choice. Their objects should help them remember the character, setting, problem, events, and solution. Students will use the items in the bag to help them retell the story to the class.

2.) Non-fiction Book Assignment: 3-D Model-- Take a trip to your local library or bookstore and select a nonfiction book about a Science or Social Studies topic. Design a 3-D model of something that you learned. Write a few sentences on an index card to help you remember important information and prepare to share what you discovered with your new class.



Writing

Keep a journal over the summer to reflect and share what you did.

- What/who did you see?
- Where did you go?
- What did you learn?
- What did you do?

You will need to write 30 <u>descriptive</u> sentences in a journal. Each sentence should be written on a different date. Underline your **verbs** in **blue**, **adjectives** in **red**, and **nouns** in **green**.

What is a noun?

A noun is a word that refers to a person, place, thing or event

What is an adjective?

An adjective is a word that describes a noun.

What is a verb?

A verb is an action word.

Example:

June 23, 2014

Today, I walked to the <u>park</u> with my <u>mom</u> and <u>played</u> on the <u>swings</u> under the <u>bright</u> <u>sun</u>.
